PECOS Updates: Implementation Delay and Searchable Database Now Available

CMS has just announced a delay in the implementation of rejections that we expected to start occurring on April 4, 2010 for any services ordered by physicians who are <u>not</u> in PECOS. <u>The new implementation date is January 3, 2011</u>. Suppliers will continue to get warnings on their remittance notices when your referring physician is not in PECOS, but claim rejections will not happen until next year. At some point during 2010, CMS will send letters directly to any physician not in PECOS, telling them that they must reenroll or they will not be able to make referrals. CMS staff also has indicated that the PECOS system will become available for DMEPOS supplier enrollment some time in 2010. We will notify you of any new information as it is announced.

Additionally, Paul Prusakowski of oandp.com has created a PECOS search engine that will greatly aid in searching the PECOS directory released by CMS. He has made it available and given free access to all of O&P for its use. Click here to access the searchable version of the PECOS database.

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UPDATE: O&P Outreach to Haiti Continues

AOPA and the American Academy of Orthotists and Prosthetists (AAOP) campaign to assist coordination of relief materials and services to the victims of the Haiti earthquake continues. In addition to donating \$15,000 to be distributed among Healing Hands for Haiti, Doctors Without Borders, and the Amputee Coalition of America (to assist with the costs of transferring used prosthetic equipment to Haiti), **AOPA** and AAOP is also coordinating an industry-wide effort by providing both the <u>AOPA</u> and <u>AAOP</u> Web sites as access points to a unified Haiti Relief Web site where people and companies can register cash, component and resource donations that will support amputee patients.

Al Ingersoll, CP, of Winkley Prosthetics, Orthotics & Pedorthics in Golden Valley, Minnesota, is currently in Haiti and has given **AOPA** permission to post this on-the-ground account of the coordination of materials and care; an outline of the protocols that are being developed to provide care to disaster victims; and instructions as to how O&P can further donate time, talent, and materials to this outreach effort. 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Make Sure Your Company Information in the 2010 AOPA Yearbook is Correct!

By now all 2010 **AOPA** members should have received a 2010 Data Verification Form, which displays the information **AOPA** has in its records for your company. *If you have not yet returned this form*, please do so immediately. This is every AOPA member's opportunity to make sure that the

company's listing (address, phone and fax, email, Web site, and employees) is complete and correct. Forms were supposed to be returned by January 8, but many are still outstanding. 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KO Policy Update

The KO Policy has been revised and the revisions are currently in effect. The revised policy has three key changes: coverage criteria for an L1810 and L1820, increased coverage for an L1832, and documentation requirements for knee instability.

An L1810 or L1820 will be covered if the patient is ambulatory and has a weakness or deformity of the knee, and this weakness/deformity requires stabilization. Previous policy didn't provide specific coverage criteria for the L1810 and L1820.

If a patient is ambulatory and has a knee instability due to Multiple Sclerosis (340), Hemiplegia (342.90), Infantile Cerebral Palsy (343.9), Paraplegia (344.1), or Mononeuritis (355.0 and 355.2), an L1832 will now be covered. In the previous policy these diagnoses were only acceptable when providing an L1843 or an L1845.

Lastly, the policy now states that when you are providing a KO to a patient due to knee instability, you must document the knee instability. This documentation must be objective (what type of instability?), and be the result of an examination of the patient. In other words just writing that the patient has knee instability will not suffice.

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LSO/TLSO Policy Update

For claims with a date of service on or after January 1, 2010 the following change in policy is in effect.

When an LSO/TLSO described by HCPCS codes L0450, L0454, L0621, L0625, and L0628 is primarily made of elastic material the device must be coded as an A4466, and is a non-covered service. The reason the devices are non-covered is because they don't meet the Medicare definition of a brace, they are not rigid or semi-rigid in construction.

Also, as an early warning, the LSO/TLSO policy includes a change that will not take effect until July 1st of this year. This change will require devices described by codes L0450-L0492 and L0625-L0640 to be reviewed by the Pricing Data Analysis Coding Contractor (PDAC) and listed on their website. If the item has not been verified and listed by the PDAC it must be billed as an A9270, a non-covered service.

AOPA is currently speaking with the DME MAC Medical Directors to seek clarification on the PDAC verification requirement. **AOPA** is trying to determine if a brace is fabricated in house must it be verified by the PDAC, or are only devices made by manufactures to be verified by the PDAC. **AOPA** will keep you informed of future policy developments.

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CMS Rescinds Proposed Change to Rules Regarding Consignment Closets

The Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) has rescinded a policy change involving consignment closets that was scheduled to go into effect on March 1, 2010.

A traditional consignment closet arrangement involves a supplier of DMEPOS providing a physician's office with a stock of medical equipment or devices that the physician may dispense to patients who have an immediate need for the equipment. The device is billed by the supplier who maintains the stock of equipment at the physician's office.

In August, 2009, CMS released Change Request 6528 which would require the physicians to take title of the equipment upon delivery from the supplier and also take responsibility for billing for the item(s) provided. Initially scheduled for implementation in September 2009, the implementation was pushed back until March 1, 2010 to allow for input from the provider and supplier community. As a result of the many comments that CMS has received from **AOPA**, the O&P Alliance and others, it has rescinded the change request to consider future implementation of this policy change.

For the immediate future, consignment closets remain an acceptable arrangement for Medicare suppliers and providers as long as they are intended for patient convenience and not to disguise an illegal "kick-back".

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AOPA Announces 2010 Pilot Grant RFP

Last week **AOPA** initiated the 2010 Request for Pilot Grant Proposals in five potential areas of Orthotic and Prosthetic (O&P) research. For 2010-2011, the association is seeking proposals for one-time grants in amounts up to \$7,500 for one year. Areas for submission are:

- a. AFO treatment of stroke appropriateness of the 5 custom criteria for custom device use
- b. Microprocessor Knees and functional value for K 2 patients
- c. Residual limb and socket interface selection criteria
- d. Vacuum assisted socket research
- e. Prosthetic Foot/ankle mechanisms assessment of current functional classifications

The leadership of **AOPA**, working in conjunction with the Center for Orthotics and Prosthetics Learning and Outcomes/Evidence-Based Practice (COPL), understands that currently there is only a modest amount of original evidence-based or outcomes research in orthotics and prosthetics. Consequently, **AOPA** is interested in funding original pilot research that will lead to larger trials that may qualify for government or other research funding support.

There will be preference given to grants that address evidence-based clinical application in orthotics and prosthetics. 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AOPA Ask For Change to McKesson Software

Recently, **AOPA** has received complaints from around the country about the use of McKesson software by private insurers. This software program apparently limits frequencies to 1 per claim line item, causing many unnecessary denials and subsequent appeals. When insurers are questioned about these denials, they indicate that this software echoes Medicare guidelines and is therefore correct.

After review of some of the McKesson parameters, this appears to be inaccurate. Therefore, **AOPA** has contacted McKesson, protesting this blanket policy of 1 frequency per line item and asking that they use Medicare's Medically Unlikely Edits guidelines instead. We have also copied the Blue Cross Blue Shield Association, Humana, Aetna, CIGNA and United Healthcare. We will keep you posted as this situation progresses.
