Time is Running Out to Register for the 2011 Policy Forum

O&P faces intense political and legislative challenges right now and **AOPA** has been consistently fighting for your interests. In the past month, **AOPA** has submitted comments to the IRS about the 2.3 percent Medical Device Excise Tax, submitted testimony to the House Energy and Commerce Committee regarding Medicaid and the states, and continued pushing for O&P to be included in the "essential health benefits package" by commissioning a study by the Society for Human Resource Management on the inclusion of O&P benefits in insurance plans

But there are aspects of these decisions and policies that you can influence by speaking to your elected representatives on behalf of O&P. You must get involved and one vital way to do it will be through attending the 2011 Policy Forum.

The 2011 **AOPA** Policy Forum will be held Monday, April 11 through Tuesday, April 12, 2011 in Washington D.C. Members will be briefed on state and national legislative activities and be prepared for face-to-face meetings with their congressional representatives. Everyone in the O&P field, regardless of specialization has a stake in how the regulations being written by Heath and Human Services (on essential health benefits) and Treasury (about the 2.3 percent medical device excise tax) Departments as well as how any new laws affecting healthcare play out in this very uncertain environment.

Your Congressman or Senator will value your input as a constituent and the specific contribution you make as a member of the O&P community to the restoration of mobility and quality of life to your patients. The Forum is designed to help everyone understand the issues and the politics which pose challenges to O&P patient care and equip everyone to have face-to-face conversations with Congressional staff and Members about parity's importance to our patients; how our O&P Medicare Improvement Act improves patient care and reduces fraud and abuse; and the need for continued research on cost effectiveness of treatment programs. Last year **AOPA** secured more than 230 meetings with Representatives and Senators.

Additionally, since personal relationships are so important when trying to convince a legislator to take action, it helps **AOPA**'s advocacy efforts if we can call upon **AOPA** members who personally know members of Congress. If you have met your Senator, Representative or their staff, tell us about this contact. If you have had a member of Congress or their staff in your office for an educational visit, let us know. Do you know a close friend or family member of a Senator or Member of Congress? Please tell us. Such information will help **AOPA** formulate game plans on upcoming legislation and will also keep us from duplicating contacts that you have already made. 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Update on Washington State's Assessment of Merits of Specific Device Types

In the November 30 issue of *AOPA* in Advance, AOPA alerted members of AOPA's comments to the Washington State Health Technology Assessment Program in regard to the benefits of reimbursing claims for microprocessor-controlled prosthetics-lower limb and myoelectric (with processor) controlled prosthetics-upper limb. AOPA was alerted to the review process on whether the state would continue to reimburse patient care providers for these devices.

The comments argued that refusing to reimburse the devices would be a disproportionately harmful action affecting a very small amputee population in the state; that there are devices that are available that meet the treatment needs of the patient and the fiscal concerns of the agency; as well as explaining the benefits-relative-to-cost present when patients are provided with devices that can restore lost mobility, and by extension, lost productivity.

The Washington State Health Care Authority released its technology assessment priorities for 2011. Click here to read the document. The good news was that Myoelectric (with microprocessor) controlled Prosthetics - Upper limb was a category that will not be assessed in 2011. The bad news is that Microprocessor controlled Prosthetics - Lower limb remained on the list for review. AOPA will continue to work to assist policy makers in Washington state understand the benefit to patients provided by prosthetic and custom orthotic devices.

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HIPAA 5010: CMS Provider Education Call

Beginning January 1, 2012, all HIPAA covered entities (suppliers, health plans, clearinghouses, billing services, etc.) will be required to use the new HIPAA 5010 format for all HIPAA covered electronic transactions (claims submissions, remittance notices, claim status requests, etc.). If you do not make the switch to the HIPAA 5010 format before January 1, 2012, you will experience delays in processing your claims with both Medicare and private payers, as the current 4010 format will not be accepted after January 1, 2012. Don't wait or hesitate, the deadline is closer than you think.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) will be conducting an educational call geared towards Medicare Fee for Service Providers and what they must do to make the switch to the new HIPAA 5010 format. The call will take place on March 30, 2011 at 2:00 pm EST. If you wish to attend the call you must register by 2:00 pm EST on March 29.

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AOPA and COPL Announce RFPs for 2011

The American Orthotic & Prosthetic Association (**AOPA**) and the Center for Orthotic and Prosthetic Learning and Outcomes/Evidence-Based Practice (COPL) announced the release of the two following RFPs:

Request for Proposal 1 - AOPA is interested in promoting research focused on improving the

knowledge about, and quality of prosthetic modalities available to Medicare-aged amputee patients requiring prosthetic knees, and comparing outcomes and effectiveness of various types of devices, to newer microprocessor prosthetic knees, as compared to conventional non-microprocessor controlled prosthetic knees. This **AOPA** RFP solicits, and will consider high-quality proposals for a single project with a one-time award in an amount projected to be \$250,000. The funding for this project is jointly provided by AOPA, Endolite, Freedom Innovations, LLC, Össur Americas, Inc., and Otto Bock.

The deadline for proposals is May 23, 2011. Successful applicants will be notified by July 1, 2011, with availability of this support to begin August 1, 2011. Reasonable efforts must be made to obtain Institutional Review Board ("IRB") approval in compliance with this time line. AOPA reserves the right to consider timeline extensions related to IRB review. The study should be completed within two years of the date of the award.

Request for Proposal 2 - For 2011-2012, AOPA is seeking proposals for one-time grants in amounts up to \$7,500 for one year. The leadership of AOPA, working in conjunction with the Center for Orthotic and Prosthetic Learning and Outcomes/Evidence-Based Practice (COPL) and its Board of Directors comprised of representatives from eight leading O&P organizations recognizes that there is a modest amount of original evidence based or outcomes research in orthotics and prosthetics. Consequently, AOPA is interested in funding original pilot research that will lead to larger trials that may qualify for government or other research funding support in the following six areas:

- a. Microprocessor Knee Stumble Recovery Benefit for Non-Variable Cadence Ambulators, and Does Restricted Access for K-1 and K-2 to Hydraulic Controls Adversely Impact Patient Safety?
- b. Validity of Energy Storing Feet AK/BK , Clinical Appropriateness and Efficacy of Dynamic Response Feet for K-3 Patients, and Defining Appropriate Levels of Variable Cadence
- c. TLSO, Reduction of Fall and/or Injury Related to Different Types of Spinal Devices Post Surgery
- d Socket Interface: Methods for Measuring Proper Socket Fit and Alignment.
- e. Vacuum-Assisted Socket Suspension Systems
- f. Open Topics Beyond the Above Priorities, Top Quality Clinical O&P Research Topics Considered
