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## O&P NEWS

### AOPA Sends Letter to Secretaries Sebelius and Solis Regarding Flawed Report

Last week **AOPA** delivered a letter and packet of materials to Kathleen Sebelius, Secretary of Health and Human Services (HHS), and to Hilda Solis, Secretary of Labor. The packet was a response by **AOPA** to a report from the Department of Labor issued to HHS as part of the HHS effort to define what is an "essential health benefit" under the new health care reform law. The report from labor speculated that approximately 50 percent of employer plans provided coverage for orthotics and prosthetics. **AOPA** argued to both departments that the number of plans which offer coverage for prosthetics and customized orthotics is, in fact, much higher.

The **AOPA** response raised questions about the flawed Department of Labor report on the basis of it having two major problems. First, the report conducted a search for the coverage of orthotics and prosthetics by using a superficial and limited set of search terms. **AOPA** argued a more robust and accurate set of search terms would have made it more apparent that a high number of private employer health plans cover O&P. Second, **AOPA** pointed out that the Department of Labor did not conduct a current survey of employer health plans in order to compile this report. Instead, it relied on only the historical data it possessed. Furthermore, this historical data was collected only from employers (and not from insurers) on a voluntary basis and so there is no way to know the extent to which their data is complete or of representative plans in general.

The packet also contained a background study on this same question conducted by the Society for Human Resource Management that showed approximately 75 percent of employer plans offer O&P coverage. Also included was a letter from Rep. Rob Andrews (D-NJ) supporting including of O&P as an essential health benefit, and similar supportive statements in the Congressional Record by Reps. Miller and Pascrell.

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### Minnesota Commissioner Sends Letter to State Legislature Critical of Current Budget Cut Proposals

As state legislatures across the country are considering cuts to Medicaid programs, **AOPA** was alerted to a budget proposal being debated in Minnesota that would, "eliminate 'optional' services, including therapies, eyeglasses and prosthetics." Members from various organizations have gotten involved in speaking out for O&P in the state and and this week **AOPA** received news that Lucinda Jesson, Commissioner of Minnesota's Department of Human Services, sent a letter to the Minnesota House and Senate expressing concerns over some budget proposals, including the one that would cut O&P. As it relates to O&P, Commissioner Jesson writes:

**Proposal to eliminate "optional" services, including therapies, eyeglasses and prosthetics.** Ending coverage for these services creates significant holes in coverage, especially for people with disabilities who often depend on Medical Assistance for much of their lives. If optional services that help people to be more independent are eliminated, some

people will substitute more expensive long-term care services such as home care assistance to meet their needs. Additionally, this proposal creates an incentive for people to go into a facility to receive therapy. Nursing homes and intermediate care facilities (that are obligated to meet people's care needs) would have to provide therapies within their current rates.

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## **AOPA EXTENDS FOR 10 DAYS DEADLINE TO APPLY FOR CLINICAL RESEARCH GRANTS: One-Time Grants of up to \$7,500 for Pilot Research Available from AOPA and COPL**

The leadership of **AOPA**, working in conjunction with the Center for Orthotic and Prosthetic Learning and Outcomes/Evidence-Based Practice (COPL) and its Board of Directors comprised of representatives from eight leading O&P organizations issued an RFP for pilot-type research grants seeking original evidence based or outcomes research in orthotics and prosthetics. **AOPA** has extended the deadline for receipt of grant proposals for an additional ten days to assure that all interested parties have the opportunity to apply. **AOPA** is seeking proposals for one-time grants in amounts up to \$7,500 in the following six areas

- a. Microprocessor Knee - Stumble Recovery Benefit for Non-Variable Cadence Ambulators, and Does Restricted Access for K-1 and K-2 to Hydraulic Controls Adversely Impact Patient Safety?
- b. Validity of Energy Storing Feet - AK/BK , Clinical Appropriateness and Efficacy of Dynamic Response Feet for K-3 Patients, and Defining Appropriate Levels of Variable Cadence
- c. TLSO, Reduction of Fall and/or Injury Related to Different Types of Spinal Devices Post Surgery
- d. Socket Interface: Methods for Measuring Proper Socket Fit and Alignment.
- e. Vacuum-Assisted Socket Suspension Systems
- f. Open Topics - Beyond the Above Priorities, Top Quality Clinical O&P Research Topics Considered

**AOPA** and COPL will give preference to grants that address evidence-based clinical application in orthotics and prosthetics. To learn more about eligibility requirements, [click here to read the entire RFP.](#)

**The original deadline, which had been listed as April 30, 2011, for these pilot research grant proposals has been extended to Wednesday, May 11, 2011.**

Successful applicants will be notified by June 15, 2011, with availability of this support to take place as shortly thereafter as feasible. The study must be completed within 1 year of the date of the award.

2. Sarcastic, cynical, or negative
3. Curses frequently
4. Openly and irrationally critical of others, including government organizations or a previous care provider

Our objective is to show the successes that people with limb loss or difference can achieve once provided the appropriate tools.
