In 2024 there were steps taken to advance the understanding and direction of O&P care. There was the introduction of care pathways and the exploration of value-driven care. There was the release of two reports highlighting the current state of care for patients with limb loss and limb difference. There were gains in state-based legislation through So Every BODY Can Move. Lastly, there was also a monumental shift in the Medicare lower limb prostheses policy that recognized the clinical benefits of select prosthetic components may offer to an entirely new population of patients.

These show that a focus on collaboration, data-driven practices, and proper policy implementation can significantly contribute to improving patient care and professional standards in O&P. This session will address how to build on these recent successes and advancements.
